Some people make collages of these frozen moments in time on their fridges (a disadvantage of stainless steel fridges is that you have to tape the treasures up, leaving a sticky residue). Maybe I'll try the front door this year. Everybody loves photos!

Our basement is full of hockey pictures. These lives were interrupted by a photographer for a few seconds, then everyone dispersed and traveled along the paths that took us to where we are today – some are divorced, some are separated from children, some are successful in business, some have been in prison. As we look at the faces captured in these still-life celluloid records, we recognize that there have been changes. In our dining room, there's a great picture of Rob with Dad and Mom in front of their yellow rose trellis. Sara snapped that shot, then they hugged goodbye and carried on with their lives – some of them only had a few more days. You see, we now know things about the futures of the folks in these photos, things they didn't know when the moment was snapped up. Sometimes we want to lunge into the picture and say, "Stop! Please! You're heading for disaster!" Other times, we want to hug the person and say, "It's true! With unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, you are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another." (2 Corinthians 3:18 ESV).

There's one photograph we can't put on our fridges, but our lives are reflections of His image. It's the little choices that send you down one path or another. This Christmas, let your future show that Christ is in your picture today. Consider no spoken word insignificant. Search your heart for stowaways of sin. Neglect no opportunity to forgive. Cast off every niggling of worry or anxiety. "Glory to God in the highest, on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased!" (Luke 2:14 ESV)
